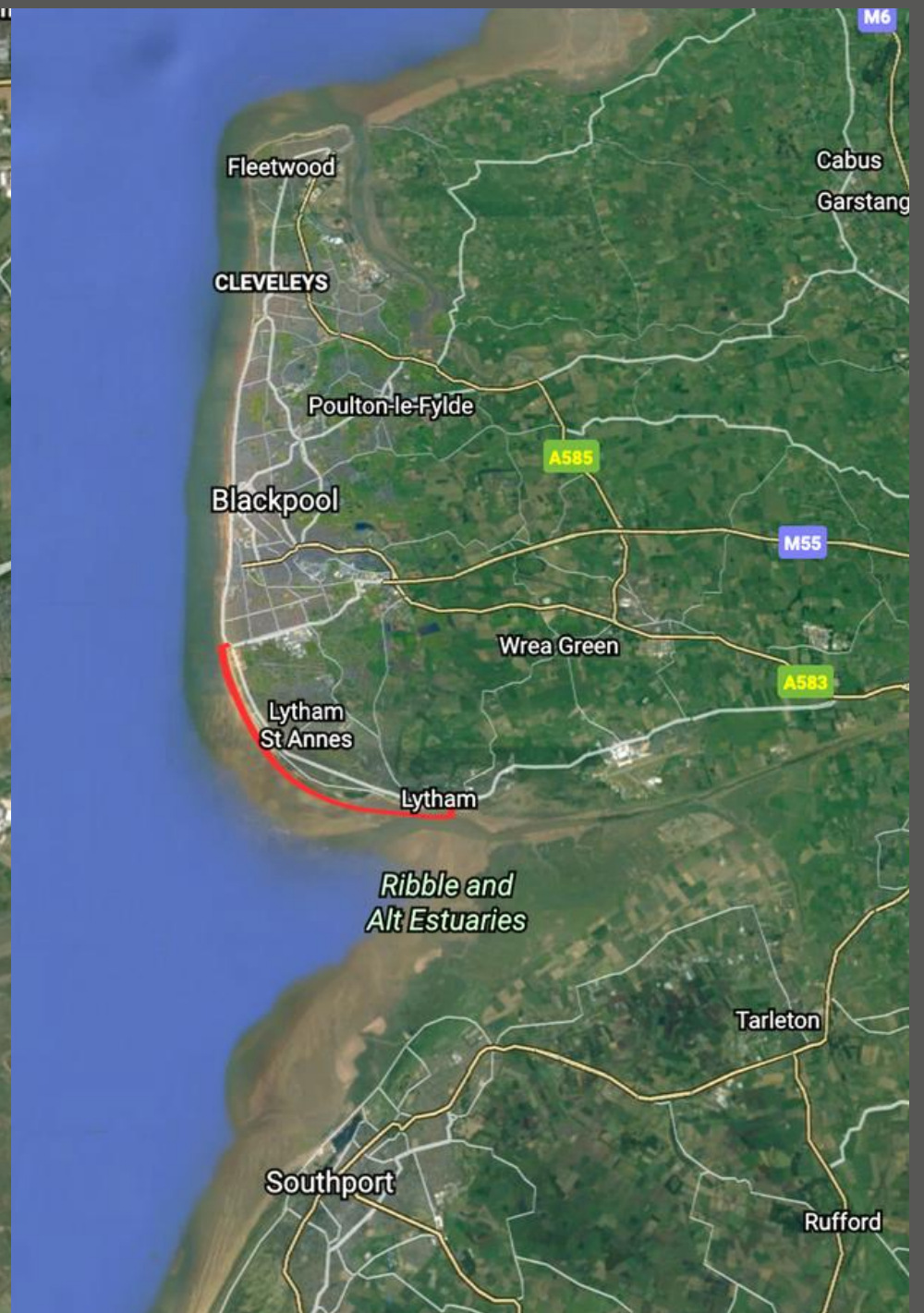
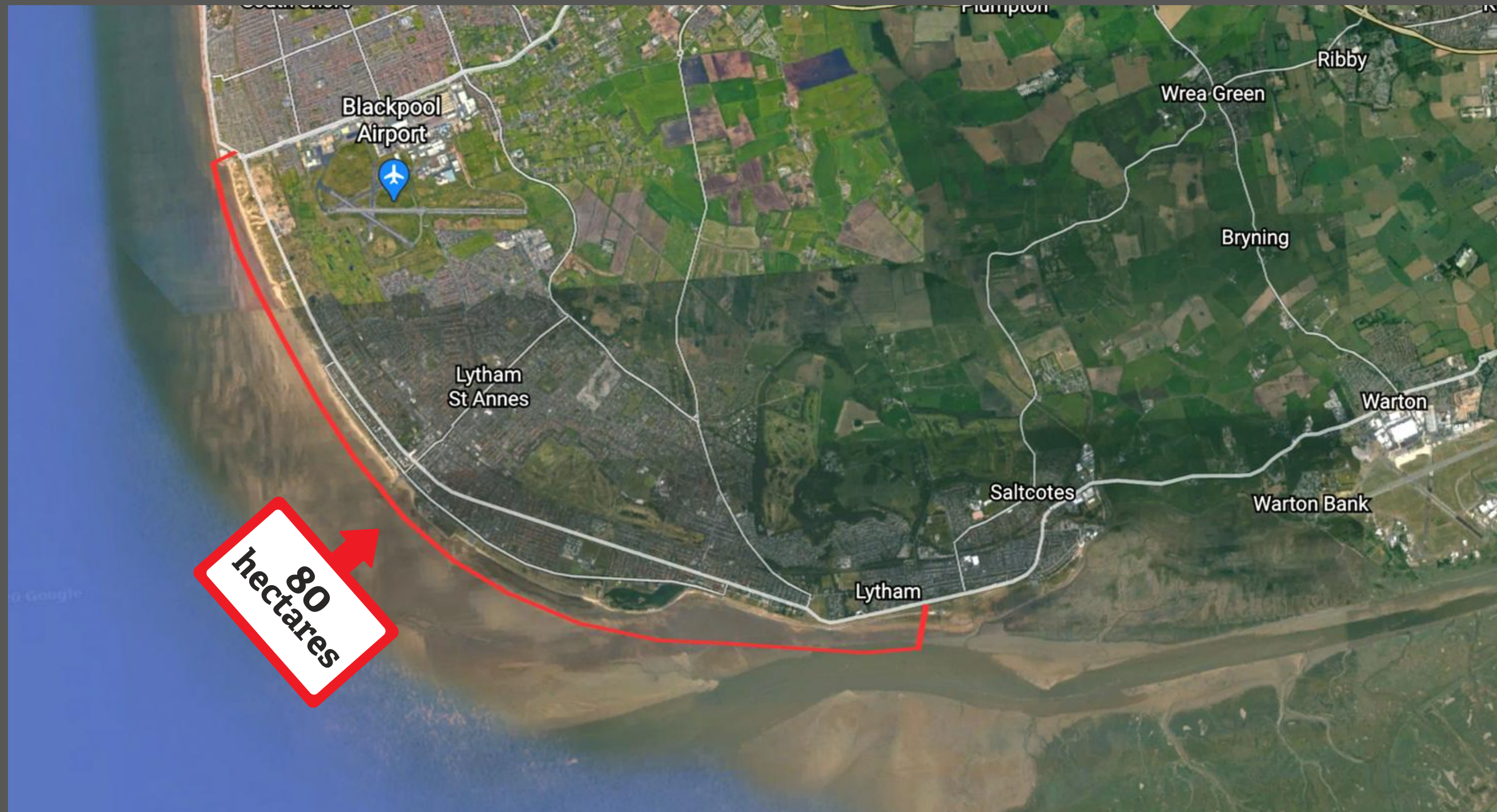

Since 1845, 80% of Lancashire's sand dunes have been lost and sand dunes have been identified as a national priority habitat.

The remaining dunes have Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) or Biological Heritage Site (BHS) protective status and are home to endemic and rare flora and fauna.

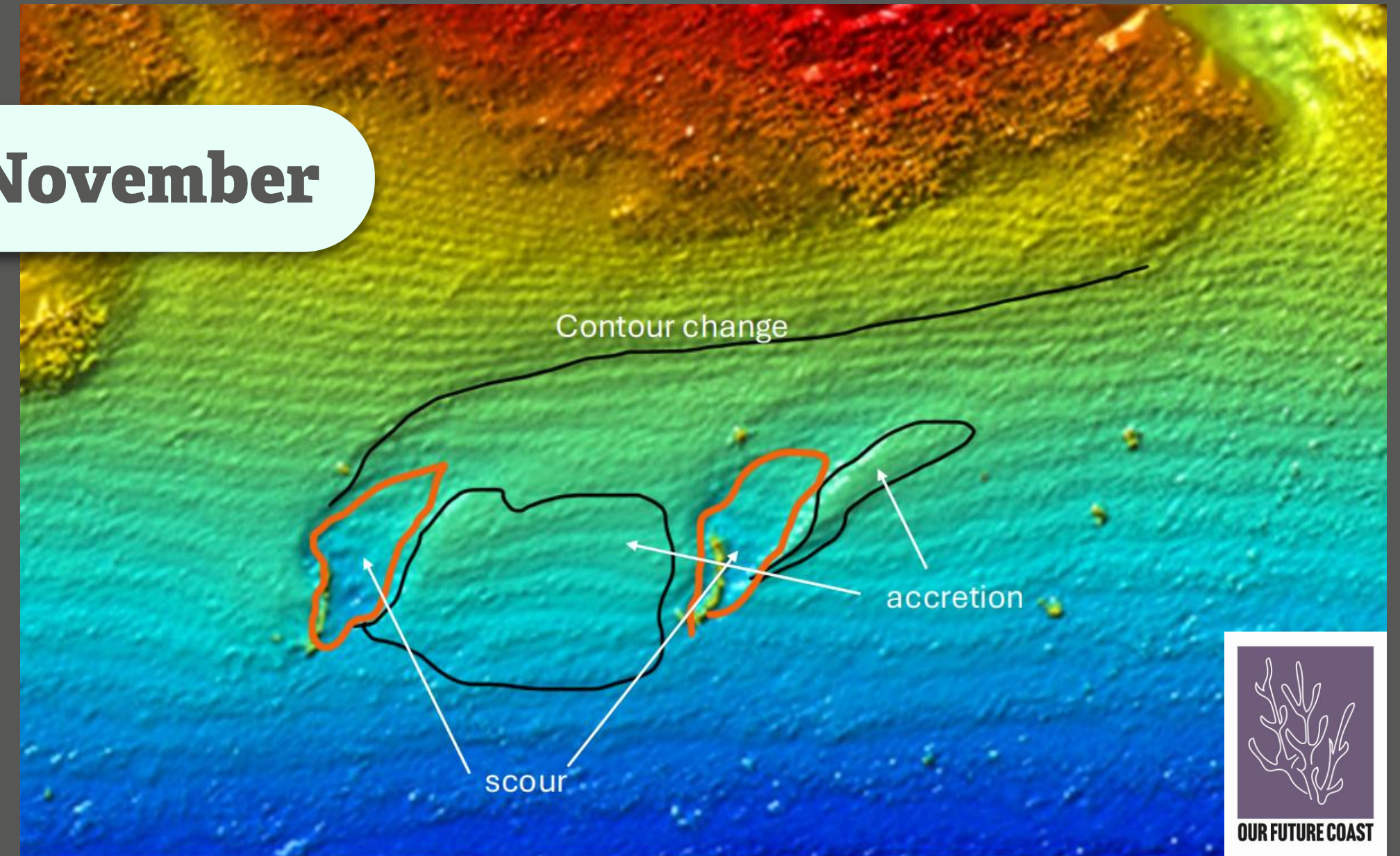

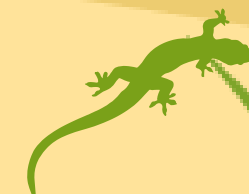
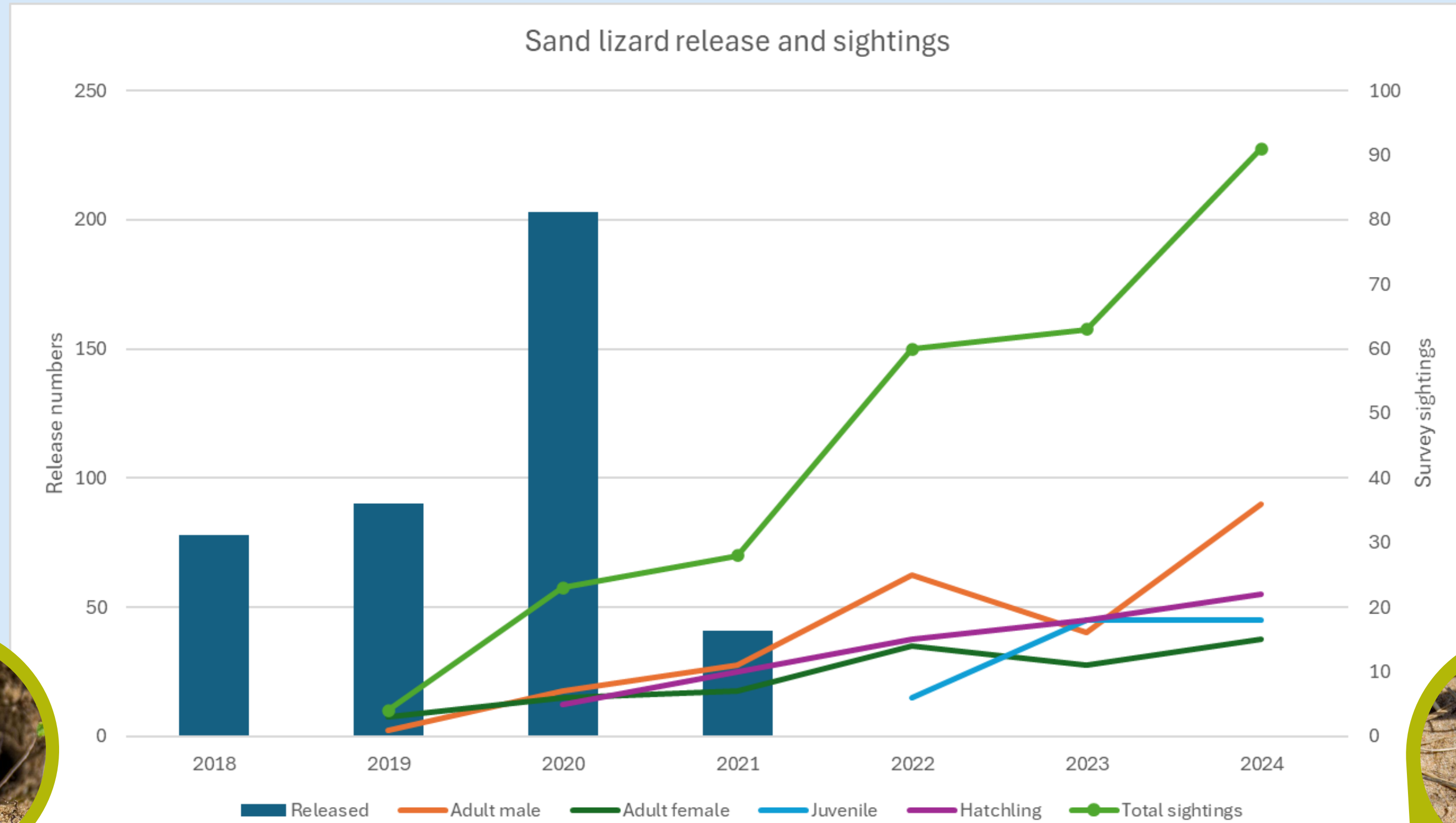
