

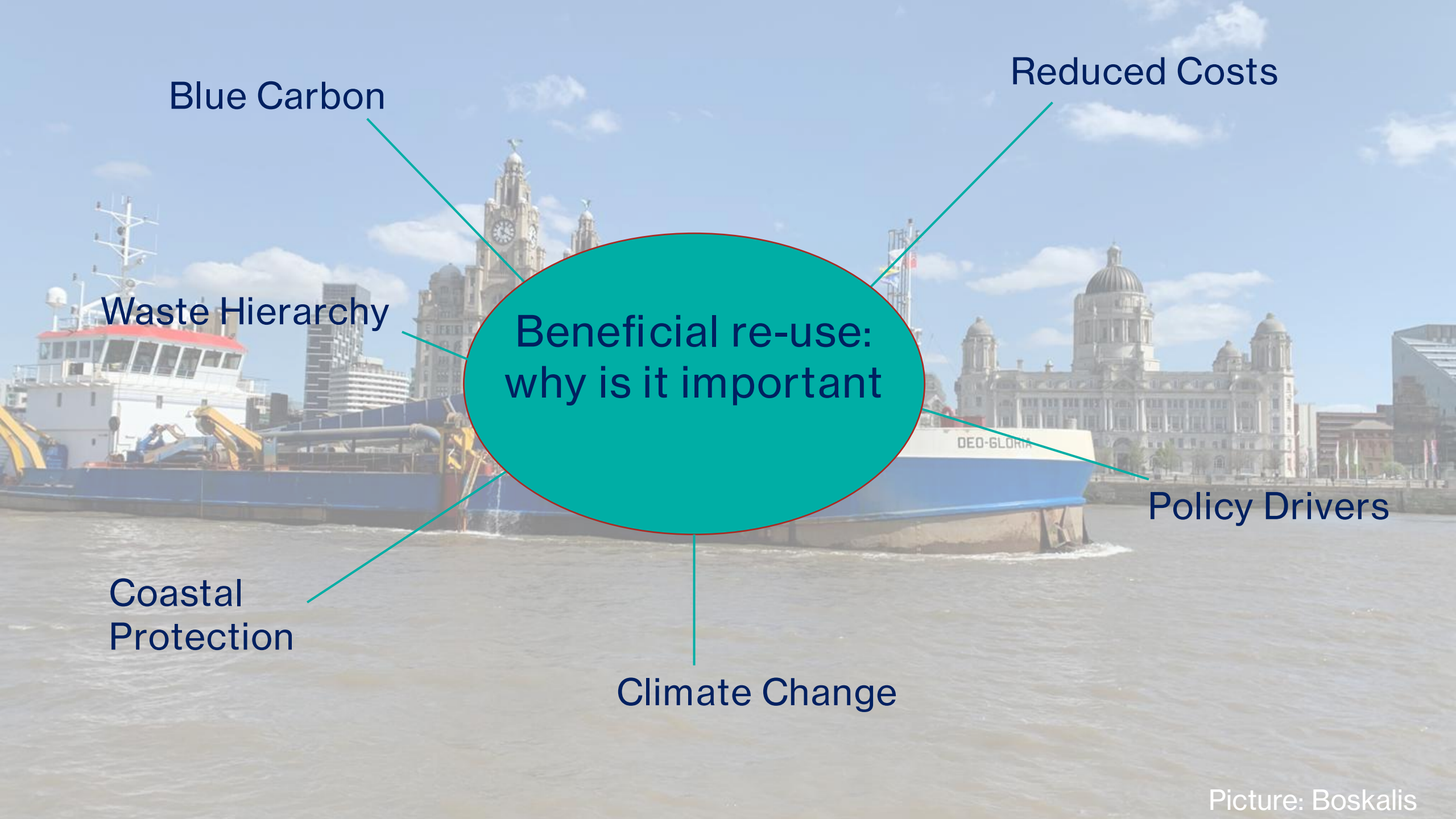

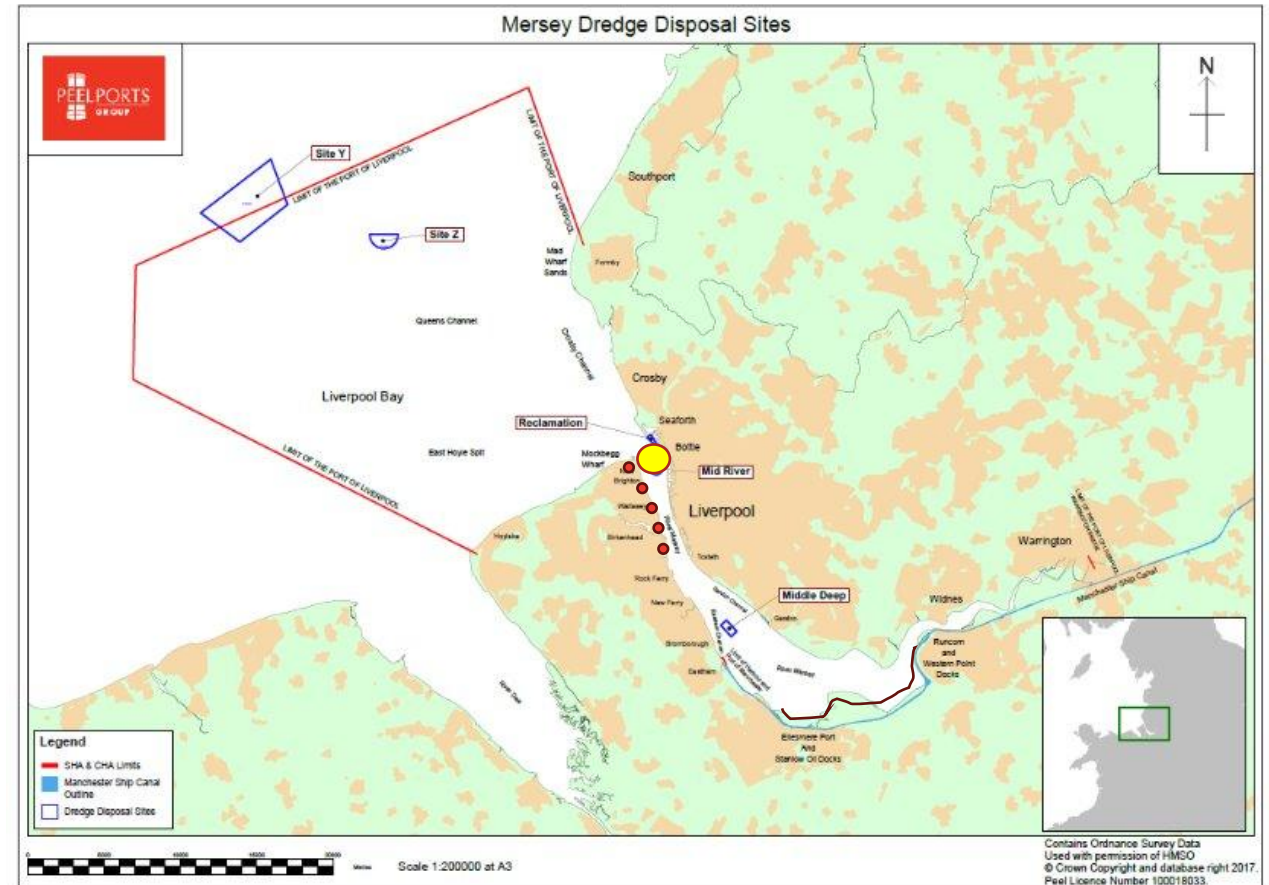

Example TOR

- Technical feasibility - considering if the project is appropriate in terms of the required sediment quality, type and quantity
- Project flexibility in terms of Peel Ports dredging programme
- Project not disproportionately costly in terms of existing dredging regime
- No significant adverse impact on other legitimate uses of the site
- Projects in line with all relevant licensing and consenting requirements

Liverpool: case study of BUDS

- BUDS Group establishment and stakeholder engagement
- Establishment of terms of reference and long list
- Utilisation of bad weather disposal ground for placement of material
- MMO licence
- Monthly foreshore monitoring surveys
- Regular meetings – sediment management group
- Continual review of new sites
