Defining the coast and its habitats

Coast: Extent of terrestrial influences out to sea, and extent of marine influences inland - so it is very much issue-based but includes land above mean high water mark- sometimes a surprisingly far way inland and land and sea below mean low water mark - again sometimes surprisingly far out to sea.

Habitat: Examples of coastal habitat include sand dunes, saltmarsh, vegetated shingle, mudflats, seagrass beds, biogenic reef, maritime cliff and slope, etc.
